MOPH MEMBER TO RECEIVE MEDAL OF HONOR

Sgt. 1st Class Leroy Petry, an Army Ranger originally from Santa Fe, NM and now a member of MOPH Chapter 0407, Lakewood WA will be only the second living recipient of the Medal of Honor when President Obama presents the medal in a White House Ceremony on July 12. Patriot Petry will be accompanied by his wife Ashley and other family members when he receives his award.



Petry was with the 2nd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment when he was wounded during a raid to capture a target in Pakiya, Afghanistan in May 2008. He and a colleague were shot while clearing a courtyard, and a bullet pierced both of Petry's legs. While taking cover, another soldier arrived and they were attacked with a grenade, which injured the two other soldiers. When a second grenade landed near them, rather than diving for cover, Petry grabbed it and tried to toss it away, but it exploded, blowing off his arm and hand just below the elbow. Petry continued fighting after tying a tourniquet on his arm. Petry's actions prevented them all from being seriously wounded or killed.

Patriot Petry deployed eight times after the 9/11 terror attacks - completed two tours in Iraq and six in Afghanistan. Previous decorations include two Bronze Stars, a Purple Heart and three Army Commendation Medals.



During rehabilitation for his injuries, doctors told him it was possible he wouldn't walk again because of the wounds to his legs. But he not only walked but became an avid golfer and learned to water ski with one hand.

Last year he enlisted in the Army indefinitely, and now works at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, south of Seattle, where he helps injured Rangers returning from deployment. (Based on variety of news sources.)

JAMES ARNESS, STAR OF GUNSMOKE, PURPLE HEART AWARDEE

James Arness, who played Marshall Dillon in Gunsmoke for over 20 years, died June 3, 2011 at his home in Los Angeles. He was 88. Although not a member of MOPH, Arness was awarded the **Purple Heart** when he was severely wounded as an Army rifleman with the 2nd Platoon, E Company, 2nd Battalion, 7th Regiment of the 3rd Infantry Division during the 1944 invasion of Anzio, Italy. He was shot in the right leg and foot by machine gun fire. Although he had several operations to alleviate his injuries, he suffered in later years from acute leg pain which sometimes hurt when mounting a horse.



He joined the Army in 1942 and was honorably discharged in 1945; he wanted to be a Naval aviator but was too tall at six feet seven inches. His decorations included the Bronze Star, **Purple Heart**, the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with three bronze stars, the WW II Victory Medal, and the Combat Infantryman Badge.

Just before his death, he wrote a letter to be posted when he was gone. He said he had a wonderful life, blessed with loving friends and family, especially his wife Janet. He also included the following: "I was honored to have served in the Army for my country. I was at Anzio during WWII and it makes you realize how very precious life is." THE CIVIL WAR - 150 YEARS AGO

Gettysburg - Decisive Victory? The nature of the result of the Battle of Gettysburg has been the subject of controversy for years. Although not seen as overwhelmingly significant at the time, since the war continued for almost two years, in retrospect it has often been cited as the "turning point," usually in combination with the fall of Vicksburg the following day. This is based on hindsight that after Gettysburg, Lee's army conducted no more strategic offensives (his army merely reacted to the initiative of General Grant in 1864 and 1865) and by the speculative viewpoint of the Lost Cause writers that a Confederate victory at Gettysburg might have resulted in the end of the war. [The casualties for both sides were over 57,000 dead or wounded.] (Source: Wikipedia)



Bruce Catton, in Glory Road, wrote: "The Army of the Potomac had won a victory. It might be less of a victory than Mr. Lincoln had hoped for, but it was nevertheless a victory - and, because of that, it was no longer possible for the Confederacy to win the war. The North might still lose it, to be sure, if the soldiers or the people should lose heart, but outright defeat was no longer in the cards."

AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION: The hotel is located approximately 10 minutes from the Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport (MSP). MOPH will welcome guests at Booth 12 on the baggage claim level at Terminal 1 (only). Although the SuperShuttles leave the airport often, they do not rotate continuously. ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTING VETERANS – ONE OF SERIES

THE AMERICAN LEGION

The American Legion, like MOPH, is a congressionally chartered veterans organization that was founded in 1919 by about 1,000 WW I officers and enlisted men in Paris. It considered each soldier in the American Expeditionary Forces as a member of the Legion. Headquartered in Indianapolis, the Legion is one of the largest veteran's organizations with 2.4 million members in 14,000 Posts worldwide. When you add Legion volunteers, the number swells to over 4 million. General MacArthur, and Presidents Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, Ford, Carter, and both Bush Presidents were all members of The American Legion.

Posts. The Post, like our Chapter, is the basic unit of the Legion, usually representing a town or part of a county. It's used for formal meetings and as a coordination point for community service projects; some Posts have bars open for limited hours.

Departments. The Posts are grouped together into a state level organization - a Department. There are 55 Departments, one for each of the 50 states, DC, Puerto Rico, France, Mexico, and the Philippines. Departments are organized into **Divisions** or **Districts** to facilitate administration.

Membership in the Legion is for honorably discharged and current personnel of the armed services who have served at least one day of active duty during a wartime period as defined by Congress. Annual membership costs \$25, but you can get a "Paid Up for Life" membership cost based on your age and the amount of your Post's dues. For example, if the member's current dues are \$25 and he's 67 years old, the monthly payment would be \$16.28 (from the monthly rate table). If the member wants to pay in full, it would be \$586 (\$16.28 x 36 months).

In addition to its regular membership, The Legion also has two volunteer arms – **The American Legion Auxiliary**, composed of women who are immediate family members of Legion member or a deceased veteran, and the **Sons of the American Legion**, males of all ages whose parents or grandparents served in the US military and were eligible for Legion membership. These volunteers work with local Posts to help with service programs or wherever needed.

Some of the programs executed by the Legion have national recognition such as American Legion Baseball and Boys and Girls States but it also has strong Americanism, Scouting (all types), Junior ROTC, VAVS, and Scholarship programs. [www.legion.org]

Many MOPH Chapters meet at Legion Posts – a gracious arrangement that has been a great benefit to the Order.

NOTE FROM THE AMERICANISM OFFICER

Lately, we have received several last minute requests for Americanism items. Members are reminded to place ALL orders for Americanism items at least 30 days in advance of needing the items. It is National HQ policy to ship these items at regular postal rates in order to hold down shipping costs, which are paid by MOPH. When members submit emergency requests, it leads to increased postal fees that could be avoided by more attentive planning. Following this simple 30 day rule will save money for other needs and we thank the membership for assisting in this effort. Ron Siebel

WAR BIRDS



Republic's P-47 Thunderbolt, also known as the "Jug," built in greater quantities than any other US fighter, was the heaviest single engine fighter to go into production, and the first piston engine aircraft to exceed 500 MPH. It was designed by two Russian immigrants who left their homeland to escape the Bolsheviks. The P-47 worked in all allied theaters, escorting bombers over Germany and Japan and shooting up ground targets throughout Europe. One of its outstanding features was its remarkable acceleration when diving, allowing it to catch up with an evading prey and blast it with eight 50-cal machine guns.

The last of the 15,686 **Thunderbolts** was produced in 1945, each costing about \$85,000 (\$1.04 million today). P-47s were used in the air forces of 21 countries, including the US, France, the UK, and China.
